**Identify your child’s potentials.**

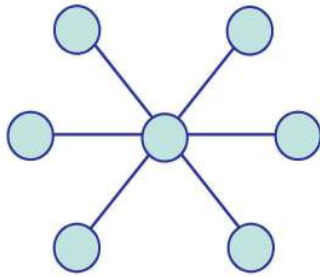
